# **More Opportunity to Serve!**

This newsletter is being written under somewhat unusual circumstances, that is, in a hotel in Kuwait near the end of a 4 country, 10 day business trip.

You probably recall that those of us involved in Grace of Giving do so as volunteers, that is, we are not compensated from Grace of Giving's funding. Thus, it will come as no surprise to you that we do other things to support ourselves and to enable us to participate in this ministry endeavor we love so much.

You may not know that I (Greg, that is) worked for 25+ years for a major international oil company, and since taking early retirement in 2000, I have worked from time to time as an independent consultant providing advice to clients (for example, multi-national and state-owned oil companies) on commercial matters relating to international energy projects.

My geographic areas of experience include southeast Asia and the Middle East, so a trip to the United Arab Emirates, Kuwait, Qatar, and Bahrain to visit previous clients and also meet new prospective clients is a key way to increase my industry business activity.

This is probably the point in the narrative where you ask yourself, "Why is he giving me all of this information? How does this relate to delivering food to

churches and missionaries along the Texas/Mexico border?"

The simplest part of the answer is this - I've intentionally limited my consulting activities in recent years so that I could devote as much time as was needed to get Grace of

Giving running in good order. That has meant drawing on my savings to meet personal expenses. After much prayer seeking God's wisdom as to how much and when to work outside of Grace of Giving's ministry, I am seeking to increase my consulting activities substantially in 2008 to assist in meeting our personal needs.

If I work more overseas this year, Grace of Giving will need more volunteers to continue our food delivery activities along the border. This is where you come in! We need volunteers to make the food delivery trips, whether it's the full 4-5 day, 2000 mile trip covering all 6 of our currently established stops, or something less to fit your available time.

We ask for your prayers in two respects - first that I would pay close attention and do only the jobs and the exact amount of outside work God has in store for me. Second, pray for just the right number and frequency of volunteers to allow Grace of Giving to run smoothly.


God knows my heart - especially that I absolutely love making the food delivery trips and have no desire to make them less frequently. However,

## **Housing Projects Update**

Our building plans for 2008 include, God willing:

 one house in Monclova, Coahuila for the Benito Amaya family:

estimated cost: \$12,000received to date: \$1,400

• four houses in Jimenez, Coahuila:

- estimated cost: \$26,000 - 27,000

- received to date: \$0

The Monclova house will be undertaken only when God provides the funds.

The Jimenez houses are planned for the period October 19th - 28th. We need the money in hand by September 1st to send it ahead for materials procurement, and we also need 50+ intrepid souls to volunteer to be building crews and to handle trip logistics (feeding the building crews is definitely a priority!).
