

Financial Update

Here's a summary of where we stand financially through the end of July, 2008:

- Year-to-date contributions that were either designated for food or undesignated: \$40,877
- Year-to-date net food costs: \$42,713
- Percent coverage: 95.7%

As a point of comparison, the percentage coverage we reported in our July newsletter was 93.7%.



We are leaving it in God's hands as to when He chooses to provide sufficient funds for the Monclova house and send us there to build it. For planning purposes, we have penciled in the week of March 17th, 2009, which is spring break for our local school system. We would like to remind everyone that our Jimenez building trip is scheduled for October 19th - 26th (*please note the date correction; our last newsletter incorrectly had the 19th - 28th*). We have set the cost for this year's trip at \$135 (based on 6 nights at the camp - shorter stays are correspondingly less - contact Greg for details).
