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A Pressing Need for Housing in Monclova

I've shared the need for a house to be built for a family in Monclova, Coahuila, Mexico, in previous newsletters. It has, unfortunately, taken us some time to get the details we'd prefer to have about these circumstances.

In the meantime, an old college friend recently contacted me to report significant interest among his colleagues in going to Monclova in March (during Spring Break) to build for this family.

God has raised up the workers we need; now we are asking Him to provide us with \$12,000 to purchase the materials necessary to build this family a new, dry, secure house.

Papa Benito (shown below) is 60 years old and is unable to provide for his large family with meager earnings from a ranch job. Thus, these 4 children

live at and are cared for by Casa Hogar Galilea, a children's home in Monclova to which Grace of Giving supplies a significant amount of food each month.

Benito and his wife, Felipa, also have 2 older sons: Raul (age 17), who lost an eye and is unable to work or attend school, and Israel (age 16), who dropped out of school to work with his father on the ranch.

Benito was previously employed at a church camp and used a small severance package to purchase a modest piece of property near Monclova.

However, he has been unable even to provide for his family's immediate needs, much less save to buy the materials for a house.


The older family members currently live in a borrowed house that has a leaking roof and no power or water. They sleep on pallets and cardboard, as they have no furniture. The house is near a railroad line, and passing trains shake the literally walls of the house! It's hard to imagine such circumstances from the comfort of our homes.

It's been on our hearts for some time to help this family. We've expanded the basic design of the houses we built last year in Jimenez from 320

square feet to 512 square feet to add additional sleeping space to accommodate this large family. This larger structure will, we estimate, cost about \$12,000 to build.

We're asking for your prayers and support for what is, admittedly, a 'fast-track' project. We are approaching this project with simple faith and reliance on God. If <u>He</u> wants us to meet this need in this time frame, <u>He</u> will provide the money! It's that simple!

Please join us in bathing this need in prayer. We don't know how or whether God will meet this need at this time. We do know this—however God shows us to proceed is His perfect plan. We ask only for His wisdom in this circumstance.

2007 Year-end Summary

Operations Summary

It's difficult to express how much joy comes from being able to serve our Lord and Savior. Rather than do so inadequately, we'd simply like to report what He allowed us to do in 2007, using your generous support to act as His hands and feet:

- 17 food delivery trips, and several other mission trips, covering more than 43.000 miles.
- Nearly 220,000 pounds of food and other goods delivered
 - 18,300 pounds per month
 - 12,900 pounds per trip
- 95 Bibles and 120 school supply kits delivered.
- 4 houses built in Jimenez, Coahuila, Mexico, in November by 57 dedicated volunteers
- Coordinated a building project for Crossing Borders Ministries in Fabens, Texas, during April—July.
- Initiated a project to build water filtration units for individual households.

Most of the food and other items delivered on each trip was purchased—the total cost of items purchased in 2007 was just over \$91,000—at an average purchase cost of 41¢ per pound!

100% of the undesignated contributions were used to purchase food and other items delivered during 2007. This undesignated amount covered 65% of the cost of the items purchased, resulting in a deficit of \$31,950. This deficit and all travel and operating costs were funded from our personal savings.
