We're Ready To Build Again!

Remember these photos? They were published in our January, 2008, newsletter and show Benito Amaya of Monclova, Coahuila, Mexico, and 4 of his 6 children. One

year ago our plea was:

"Please join us in bathing this need [i.e., a house for the Amaya *family*] in prayer. We don't know how or whether God will meet this need at this time. We know this do however God shows us to proceed is His perfect plan. We ask



only for His wisdom in this circumstance." [comments added]

You've joined us as we prayed about this need for more than a year. God has now entrusted us with sufficient money to purchase the materials to build a 16' x 32' house with a living area and 4 small bedrooms - in fact, the money was wired to our colleague in Acuña, Hugo Garcia, today (January 21st), and he and his brother Julio, who come originally from Monclova, are organizing the slab and materials for a mid-March construction target.

Now it's up to us to become the hands and feet of Jesus and go to Monclova to build the house. Here's the schedule we have set, which is planned around our local (i.e., Clifton ISD) Spring break and also other schedules in the Dallas/Fort Worth area:

Tuesday, March 10: Crew #1 travels to Monclova, which is about 160 miles south of Eagle Pass, Texas/Piedras Negras, Coahuila - a 9-10 hour drive from our Clifton, Texas, home in central Texas near Waco.

Wednesday - Friday, March 11-13: Crew #1 frames, sides and roofs the house and also completes all other exterior work.

Saturday, March 14: Crew #1 travels home.

Sunday, March 15: Crew #2 arrives in Monclova.

Monday - Wednesday, March 16-18: Crew #2 installs electrical and drywall, muds, tapes and paints the interior, and does all interior trim/built-in work.

Thursday, March 19: Crew #2 travels home.

We need at least 6-8 people on each crew. Here's what you will need to bring if you come:

• a passport - everyone will stop in Piedras Negras to get a visa to travel south into Coahuila state.



• air mattress/cot and sleeping bag, blankets, etc. - we will stay at Casa Hogar Galilea in Monclova, where the children shown in the picture have been living and where a significant quantity of Grace of Giving's deliveries are used.


• hand tools only (i.e., hammer, tool

belt, etc.) - we will provide all major tools and other materials needed to complete the house.

- \$10 per person per day to contribute toward food, etc.
 the ladies at Casa Hogar Galilea will cook for us!
- enough private vehicles to get everyone to/from Monclova - I have information about the registration requirements for taking private vehicles into Mexico -Mexican insurance is also a must.
- everyone will kick in toward the cost of transportation.

Please let me know ASAP if you wish to join us. We will need to get a list of participants to our coordinators in Mexico a bit ahead of time to facilitate entry, obtaining visas, etc.

It has always been very important to us that Grace of Giving's operations are as transparent as possible. With that goal in mind, here's a summary of Grace of Giving's 2008 activities and finances:

- 12 food delivery trips along the Texas/ Mexico border
- 2008 total deliveries: 148,700#
- Average delivered per trip: 12,400#
- Breakdown (yearly totals):
 - Beans: 37,350#
 - Rice: 52,700#
 - Sugar, flour & masa: 22,150#
 - Vegetables, fruit, canned meat: 11,300 cans
 - Cooking oil, condiments, toothpaste, bar soap, etc.: >7,900 items
- Paper good: 230 cases
- 4 houses built (3 in Jimenez and 1 in

Acuña)

- 120 school supply kits delivered
- Contributions received: \$103,538
- Designations of contributions:
 - Food/undesignated: \$64,626
 - Monclova house: \$5,992
 - Pastor Juan Lara: \$1,570
 - Jimenez houses: \$26,050
 - Building trip expenses: \$5,045
 - Terlingua church: \$255
- Total cost of items delivered: \$77,799

83.1% of these purchase costs were <u>covered by food/undesignated</u> <u>contributions!</u>
