## It's Time to Build a Church!

On September 10<sup>th</sup> 2008, Greg Beard emailed me this simple drawing of a building. The subject of the e-mail said "Church Plan" and the body of the e-mail said "Comments?" I had to call him to find out what he was even talking about. He told me that he dreamed of developing a plan for a small church building that we could build for a church family in either the USA or Mexico. I thought he was crazy. At the time Grace of

Giving had only built small (16' x 20') houses for families in Mexico. I personally had never built anything larger than those houses.

Since that humble beginning, we have reached where we are today. Grace of Giving now has fully developed the plans for a 1,980 square foot building that will seat close to 100 people in the sanctuary. The facility has two classrooms, 2 restrooms, a coat closet and a mechanical / storage room.

We have identified a small congregation, New Jerusalem

Church, in Terlingua, Texas, that needs a building. Terlingua is 78 miles south of Alpine, Texas, on the western boundary of Big Bend National Park. Grace of Giving has been delivering food to this community through our faithful missionary friends in Terlingua, Lee and Margie Ball, since 2004. New Jerusalem Church now has property where they can build the building and have already raised most of the funds for the construction.

At this time, Grace of Giving would like to ask for workers to help construct this church building. We are looking for individuals that, first and foremost, have a heart for missions work. It would be incredibly helpful as well to find individuals with general construction skills or specific trade skills. Some of the trades that are needed are framing, drywall hanging, tape and bedding, electrical, plumbing and air conditioning. If you feel that you have the skills needed and are willing to help a congregation have a new church home, please contact us.

Here's the schedule we have set for this project:


Week 1 (March 8-12): Frame the walls and roof trusses.

Week 2 (March 15-19): Install soffits and siding.

Weeks 3 &4 (April 12-23): Drywall, tape and bed.

Week 5 (May 3-7): Install trim.

Week 6 (May 17-21): Final trim out.




Our friends at New Jerusalem will be doing other tasks in between these work weeks, such as installing the roof and insulation, pulling electrical, etc.

There are a few hotels locally to stay at and the church members have offered their homes for us while we are working. Also, they have agreed to cook us a hot meal in the evenings. The exact cost for each volunteer would vary depending on when you work and who you work with.

If you would like to volunteer individually, we will set you up with others that are going. If you have a group that can handle one of the tasks in its entirety, that would be great also. The important thing is simply - we need your help to raise this church building to glorify God in this remote part of West Texas!!

- From our FBC Clifton friends Terry & Debbie Spicer in memory of Mr. Charles Wilborn of McKinney.


