What a meaningful journey we began as we headed into the south part of Texas. Our first surprise began when we realized, right at the last minute, our family cat had gotten closed up in the Grace of Giving trailer, and almost made the border trip with us! But our great joy was taking Anita Richter down to Eagle Pass, who was relayed later that day to an orphanage further into the interior of Mexico.

Earlier this year, Anita and her husband Travis had helped with a Grace of Giving building project, giving them an appetite to step out of their comfort zone in the city of Ft. Worth, stretch themselves, and see what God was saying to them about His plans.

Our next delivery found us meeting Isaias Silas, a pastor from Piedras Negras, who works with 60 boys in Mexico. At our Del Rio delivery, Irma introduced herself as a director of a Mexican orphanage. Both Isaias and Irma were excited to teach children about Jesus..... and change the next generation. The food from Grace of Giving helps make that transformation possible.

Bernie and Gracie Segura in Van Horn took us to their church and showed us where VBS was taking place that afternoon, and every afternoon of the summer. Gracie's heart is to teach children about Jesus and wanted to be doing that everyday so children would be learning the things of the Lord. Even though they are not able to pastor in Mexican villages right now, they are rising up wherever God puts them, and Bernie was faithfully visiting the jail and bus station to minister to people.

Elfi Register and Joan Wilson of Crossing Borders Ministries in Fabens took huge steps of faith a number of years ago, as they felt God leading them to quit jobs and be full-time missionaries. From the joy in their faces, the life they are living is so much more wonderful than anything money can buy. They organize a time for pastors to come up from Mexico every week for Bible study, a time of accountability and encouragement, then food is sent to be distributed to their congregations. Elfi and Joan have also begun working with the youth in their community, where young girls are inviting Jesus to live in their hearts, and learning a different way of living life. They are impacting their community so God is glorified!

In Presidio, there were representatives of five churches who were grateful hearts for the staples provided for their

church bodies. Wonder if we Americans would be so thrilled to receive beans, rice, flour & sugar----but those staples are providing food for hungry souls.

Our last stop at Terlingua took us to our mentors in the Lord, Margie & Lee Ball. They completely ignore the definition of 'retirement' in the dictionary. Their lives serve as such a huge reminder that God uses us every DAY we have on earth. The food pantry they've started, the supplies they send into Mexico for children's ministry, the sewing Margie has taught the women, the children excited about the 'Bible Gang', the welding Lee is doing for a trailer to haul supplies, the church they helped to start up for the Hispanic people, and the stand for Christ they've taken in the community.... don't indicate a retired couple just looking to go through another day. They are living exciting, fruitful lives for God! The best thing is they are teaching those following, so the legacy in the Lord will continue......



## **Fall Building Trip**

Our plans have changed a bit since we last communicated with you in June. Based on the indications we have received from groups that have joined our building trips in previous years, we expect to have a smaller team this year to do the construction work on our trip. As a result, we now plan to build only three houses in October and are making our ongoing plans on that basis.

As reported to you in June, we have advanced the dates for our fall building trip by one week, to October 11-17, 2009. The good news is that the cost for building an individual house this year is essentially unchanged from last year - \$6,500. Thus, we will need to raise \$19,500 for materials for these three homes.

Currently, we have a firm pledge for the entire cost of one house, and another church group has advised that they are likely to sponsor a house this year as well.

That leaves the third house essentially unfunded at this time.

Please continue to include the need for laborers and funds for our building trip in your daily prayers. Please also join us in praying that there will be no security issues that might require cancelling the trip altogether. So far, all reports we have received from Acuña/Jimenez indicate that things are very calm there.
