

## **Financial Summary**

Year-to-date we have received contributions totaling \$32,248. Of this total, \$734 was designated for non-food purposes, leaving \$31,514 for food purchase/deliveries.

Through May, the food delivered to our ministry partners cost \$30,096.

Thus, as we head into June, we currently do not have sufficient funds to meet the entirety of our estimated June food purchase costs (\$6,200).

We have been blessed so far this year to be able to pay for all of our food purchases with funds contributed for that purpose. However, like many charitable organizations, our contributions have fallen off a bit as of late.

Please join us in praying for the funds necessary to meet out food purchase costs, and thank you for your support so far in 2008!

## **Fall Building Trip**

We have advanced the dates for our fall building trip by one week, to October 11-17, 2009. Unfortunately, as was the case last year, we encountered a conflict in the booking for the camp in Mexico where we stay on our trips. Last year the same group, His Work (from the Chicago area), kindly changed their dates to allow Grace of Giving to use the camp. This year, we have returned the courtesy and changed to allow His Work to use their preferred dates.

Please include both of these groups in your daily prayers. We will need laborers and funds for our fall trips, and we also are praying that there will be no security issues that might require cancelling the mission trips altogether.

Grace of Giving plans, God willing, to build 4 houses again this fall, at an estimated cost of \$26,000 for materials.
