<u>Inflation Hits Us — Just Like You!</u>

It'll come as no surprise to any of you who shop for groceries that food costs have shown some staggering increases in the last year. I certainly can't give you more than a semi-educated guess as to the cause for these increases, but I can tell you the result. The total amount we pay for basic commodities has increased substantially in recent months, and we've no evidence that this circumstance will change any time soon.

The table shown below will give you an idea of what we've been dealing with in respect of bulk commodity costs. These are only examples of some of the worst increases we've seen.

We are attempting to compensate for these increases, at least to some extent, primarily by cutting back on our food delivery trips from once every three weeks to once per month. We are also contuing to look for ways to make others aware of our work (to increase contributions) and for ways to reduce our food costs.

You can help this effort in several ways. First, you can pass a copy of this newsletter to somone who isn't already receiving it and encourage them to support Grace of Giving. Nonfat dry milk (4.4#)	\$7.69	\$13.66	78%

Since beans, rice, sugar, and flour represent 70% of the commodities we deliver (on a weight basis), you can imagine what these increases are beginning to do to our food costs. Overall, comparing January, 2007, to February, 2008, the total cost of food and necessities delivered rose 22% from 37¢ per pound to 45¢ per pound.

We don't mind doing a bit of driving to get good prices!

Finally, join us in praying for God to supply the resources we need to resume operating this ministry at levels comparable to 2007.

Water Filter Update


Hurrah! We've finally been able to get our first concrete Biosand water filter poured.

We've been working with a company in Fort Worth to get filters poured at low cost, and the process has been delayed by some rather unfortunate corporate issues resulting in reorganizations and relocations.


Regardless, God has seen us through the delays, and we now have a filter in hand that we are testing to be certain it meets all of our needs.

Once this process is complete, we hope, God willing, to get something on the order of 20 filters poured in short order to meet needs in the houses Grace of Giving has built in Mexico and also in an alternative school/orphanage being established by the Wilderness Hispanic Mission near the city of San Fernando, Tamaulipas, Mexico.

Housing Projects Update

In January we reported to you the need for a house to be constructed in Monclova, Coahuila, Mexico for the Benito Amaya family. We put the project forward to you on the basis that if God wants the house built, He will provide the \$12,000 necessary for the materials to build it.

It seems to us that God has been pretty clear about what He wants done, at least in terms of whether this project should be undertaken in March during spring break. We have, since our last newsletter, received just \$400 towards its funding.

On this basis, we do not plan to build this house in March; we will instead hold the \$400 in reserve and continue to await God's guidance for when and if He wants us to proceed.

In the meantime, mark your calendars for October 19th through 26th, which is when we're scheduled to go on our fall house building trip to Jimenez, Coahuila. We need \$26,000—\$27,000 and 50+ volunteers to build 4 houses in that week. Please pray about joining us. I believe it'll change your life!
