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A Week on the Road


It never ceases to amaze me how God has blessed and grown Grace of Giving's ministry. Each food delivery trip has become a substantial logistical undertaking, and we thought you might find it interesting to learn what a typical trip entails. To say simply that it's 5 days on the road covering 1,900+ miles doesn't quite seem to do justice to the effort, so here's a day-by-day description of what we do every 3 weeks.

<u>Day 1</u>

We begin our week's endeavors by heading south toward Eagle Pass, Texas, with a stop along the way in Austin to

pick up rice. We make every effort to be good stewards of the resources you entrust to us, and we can often save several dollars per 50# bag of rice by buying it in Austin.

Three hundred fifty plus miles later, we arrive at Lighthouse Baptist Church in Eagle Pass, where we deliver to Iglesia



items for the day's deliveries. These two stops mean loading around 5,000# into the trailer by hand, and we then drive a short distance east to Fabens, to stop Crossing at Borders Ministries (at First Baptist Church in Fabens: Crossing Borders feeds, among others, 32 Mexican

Bautista Nueva Esperanza (for a children's feeding ministry in Piedras Negras, Coahuila), and to two children's homes, Casa Hogar Galilea (Monclova, Coah.) and Casa Hogar Nueva Fuente de Vida (Jimenez, Coah.).

We're able to visit with our friends in Eagle Pass for a few minutes before departing for the last leg of the day's journey, which takes us about 60 miles northwest along the border to Del Rio.

In Del Rio, we unload the remainder of what we originally had in our trailer for use by Voice of Mexico Ministries, Esperanza Missions (a home for unwed mothers in Acuña), Iglesia Emmanuel (for a senior adult feeding minpastors and their families). Ninety miles further east in Van Horn is where we make our second delivery of the day to our good friend, Pastor Bernie Segura (Bernie takes his food to three small churches in Mexico, where he has been the pastor for 28 years!).

Finally, it's back again to El Paso, with another empty trailer, to rest before embarking on the remaining legs of the week's trip.

Day 4

Two more morning stops for final provisions results in a slightly smaller load today (around 4,500#), which we take (Continued on page 2)



Day 2

No deliveries today! Just a 425 mile drive to El Paso with an empty trailer to get positioned for tomorrow.

<u>Day 3</u>

We usually make two stops in El Paso this morning, at Sam's and at Economy Cash and Carry, to get the food

Five days and 1,900+ miles are behind us once again. We've delivered more than 14,000# of food and personal items, which affect the lives of hundreds, if not thousands, of people along the border.

More than that, we've helped to spread the joy of knowing Jesus Christ by sharing His love with those we encounter.
