Grace of Giving was established in April, 2004, to deliver bulk foods (such as beans, rice, sugar, flour and masa), canned goods, personal items (e.g., toiletries and baby needs), Bibles and tracts to churches and ministries along the Texas/Mexico border.

Since i t s inception, Grace of Giving has delivered excess of 75,700 pounds of food and personal items to "clients", together with 240 Spanish language Bibles and 350 tracts.

Total project expenses: \$2,176.28



Our Needs ...

Thank you for your prayerful support of Grace of Giving's first six months. Please continue to pray that we will glorify God in all of our activities.

Please also prayerfully consider whether you can financially support Grace of Giving's ministry on a monthly basis.

Here are some examples of how your financial support affects people:

- \$10 per month buys 5 Spanish language Bibles, which are used to disciple new believers whose doors were often first opened to the Gospel by gifts of beans and rice.
- \$25 per month purchases about 100 pounds of rice, providing about 50 people with one meal per day for a month.
- \$60 per month purchases 100 pounds each

of rice and beans, providing substantial nutrition to about 100 people for a month.

• \$100 per month will purchase nearly

600 pounds of flour, which can be used to prepare literally thousands of tortillas.

40-45 cents per can.

compensation for their services and currently cover all of their travel expenses.
